Our home-based Religious Education program is suitable for Government School children beginning in Grade 3. Our program is designed to assist parents in preparing their children for the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist (First Communion) and Confirmation.

It is a home-based program giving you the resources to work with your children at home. To support you we run workshops throughout the year. Where your child's progress can be assessed and we can expand on what you have been doing at home. Our program is cumulative therefore each of the four years are important.

1st Year - Sacramental Introduction

2nd Year - Preparation for Reconciliation and First Holy Communion

3rd Year - Intensive faith development and preparation for Confirmation

4th Year - Confirmation and ongoing faith development

1Cor1.23

Dear Priests and Deacons,

You may have heard discussion in the media about the Church's participation in the National Redress Scheme for survivors of institutional child sexual abuse. The Archdiocese is committed to joining this Scheme. Senior church officials have spent the past few months finalising the procedures and documentation required for all dioceses linked to the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference to join the Scheme. This has been a complex process both for Church entities and for the Commonwealth Government.

A special company has been established, Australian Catholic Redress Ltd, by which dioceses will interact with the Redress Scheme. This week the bishops of Australia are signing the Participation Deeds by which their dioceses will join the Company and hence the Redress Scheme. For the Archdiocese the canonical approvals have been obtained and the Participation Deed signed and sent to Australian Catholic Redress Ltd. It is anticipated that the various legal formalities including the issuing by the responsible Minister of a declaration admitting the Archdiocese together with other dioceses to the scheme will be completed in the coming weeks thereby allowing survivors of child abuse in Catholic parishes and institutions to apply for redress.

A number of Catholic religious congregations have indicated that they will separately join the National Scheme.

The Catholic Church, like other bodies and indeed some State governments, is not delaying its participation in the Redress Scheme, but simply taking the necessary time in conjunction with the Commonwealth to put the most appropriate procedures in place.

Survivors of institutional child sexual abuse are encouraged to approach the Redress Scheme or to approach the Church directly should they wish to do so.

Apricol Chicken

While I love cooking my family great meals, there are some things that tip me over the edge.

Acts 15:1-21

Reference: "It is my judgment, therefore, that we should not make it difficult for the Gentiles who are turning to God. (Acts 15:19 NIV)

Explore: For some reason I always struggle to find apricot nectar on the supermarket shelf. It's a normal sized can with a picture of an apricot on it, however, it's the most illusive item in the whole shop.

It's an essential ingredient to making Apricot Chicken, which is one of my family's favourite dishes. It's easy to make and a taste sensation once baked.

When looking for the essential nectar I always start off in the canned fruit aisle. It seems that the supermarkets do not consider the nectar of apricot made out of fruit! Then I head into the baking section, which is a rookie mistake that I seem to make EVERY time.

Finally I arrive in the correct location, the juice aisle. You would think that I finally reach success here, but often the can is either up too high, or out of stock, that I throw my hands up in the air and give up.

While I love cooking my family great meals, there are some things that tip me over the edge. Surely there's a meal that causes me less stress than Apricot Chicken!

Application: Our family is blessed to have a whole range of options for a meal, so removing apricot chicken from the menu is not going to affect our future. However, there are often hurdles that come into our lives which can stop us from doing really important things.

A bad mark on an assignment can stop us from trying hard with other assessments; a close friend who suddenly passes away can stop us from getting close to anyone again; a big binge on food can stop us from trying to get back on the healthy bandwagon. It's sad when barriers get in the way of important things in our lives.

It's even worse when these barriers did not have to be there in the first place. Often we put certain criteria in place to protect that which is important to us, and yet, that criteria often excludes others.

This happened in the early church. A new group of people were coming to faith and the older believers were struggling to adapt to include them.

There are some things in our faith that are nonnegotiable. However, there is a great deal to our faith that is best practice for us. This doesn't mean that we should judge others for not doing likewise, or exclude them for doing differently.

If there's anything we can learn about Christ it is His constant acceptance of ALL people. Let's not hold so tightly to our religion that we lose sight of our Saviour.

Prayer: Lord, You are more powerful than any barrier we can create, but help us to embrace people rather than push them away from Your love. Amen.

Each time we move I make a concerted effort to get to know my neighbours. Waving to each other as we put out the bins is one thing, but I've strived to build decent relationships with those who live nearby.

The last house we lived in I was more successful than previous attempts. I was a similar age to my neighbours and they were always up for a chat when I made the time.

Unfortunately, we moved house again before we had the chance to really build life-long friendships. There are a few friendships that happen instantly, however, most relationships take an extended period of time to build.

Application: Life can get so busy that we don't take the time to make new friends and cultivate new relationships. Due to our regular moving I have not been able to maintain any of my previous neighbourly relationships, besides a bit of Facebook interaction.

You can really make a difference if you settle for an extended period of time, allowing relationships to grow and trust to develop.

It's the same with discipleship. Many people don't instantly become a follower of God as soon as they hear the good news. It often takes a long period of time, with a faithful friend, to gradually chip away at the barriers of disbelief.

We can sometimes focus too much on the next best thing rather than settling into our current positions and building great relationships that develop faith. Let's not rush into moving and changing but recognise that there is a time to move but also a time to plant our feet.

Prayer: Lord, when things get tough it often feels easier to just pick up and move on. Help us to persevere through trials so that we come to rely on You and to build the strong relationships that are needed to openly share Your love. Amen.

All the money raised and sold in our shops goes to all these programs which make a happier society for families and single people.


Our members who work in all different fields bring their gifts to our group and we have fun together assisting people in need which makes it all worthwhile.



Draw a picture of the newly born Jesus





Reading 1

Sir 3:2-6, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother. Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard. Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother. My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life; kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins —a house raised in justice to you.

Reading 2 1 Jn 3:1-2, 21-24

Beloved:

See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. And so we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence in God and receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us.

Gospel

Lk 2:41-52

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to

Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.


