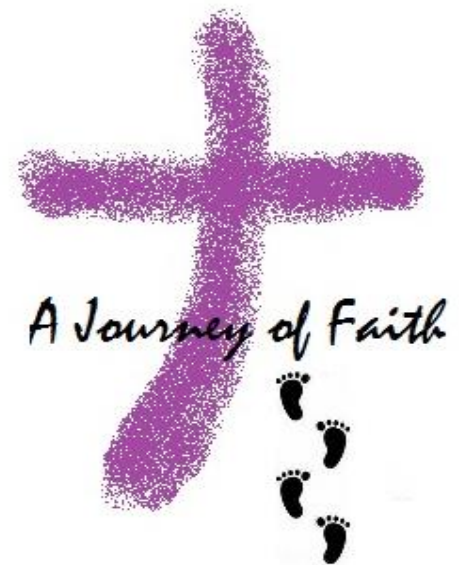

Are you celebrating your 25th, 40th, 50th or 60th-70th wedding anniversary this year?

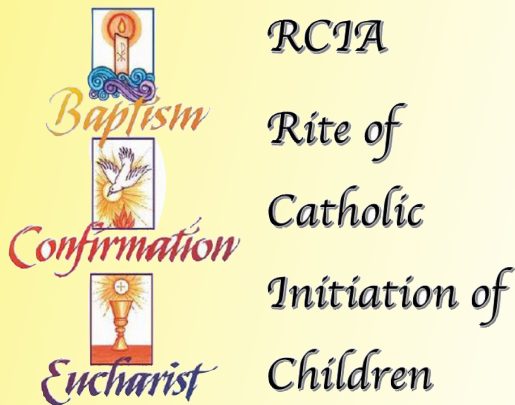

Re Voluntary Assisted Dying

Sunday 16 June 2019

Dear friends,

On the morning of Wednesday 19 June 2019 we will wake to a new, and deeply troubling chapter of health care in Victoria. On that day the *Voluntary Assisted Dying (VAD) Act* (2017) comes into effect, creating the legal possibility for a person to end their own life or a doctor ending it on request in particular circumstances. What is being referred to as ‘VAD’ is a combination of what in plain-speaking is more commonly known as *physician assisted suicide* and *euthanasia*.

Many people support euthanasia in various forms, and some also express a belief in God. A number of the loudest voices, including some members of the Victorian Parliament, have called VAD a ‘compassionate’ response to suffering, and those who oppose VAD have been accused of lacking in compassion.

Contrary to this position, Pope Francis has encouraged ordinary Catholics everywhere to resist euthanasia and to protect the old, the young and the vulnerable from being cast aside in a “throw-away culture.” Instead, Francis calls us to follow Christ by accompanying people with compassion, sharing hope not fear. In Victoria, we have entered a moment in which we are called to join this task.

Christians in Victoria, as in any other time of history, are now challenged to show a different approach to death and the dying, one which accompanies every person as they are dying and allows them to love and to be loved to the very end. We cannot cooperate with the facilitation of suicide, even when it seems motivated by empathy or kindness. These words will sound hard to hear, but as pastors of the Catholic dioceses of Melbourne, Ballarat, Sale and Sandhurst, we feel a responsibility not just to say “no” to VAD, but to give every encouragement to model a way of life that renders VAD unnecessary.

We call to mind Saint Gianna Beretta Molla and Blessed Franz Jagerstatter who witnessed to the moral commitments that arose out of their faith by their conscientious objection. Gianna and Franz lived in the twentieth century – not that long ago – and were called by the Lord to witness to the dignity of human life despite great personal cost. There are countless other examples and we draw encouragement and strength from their witness of self-giving. In our particular circumstance, St Gianna and Bl Franz can help us find our way ahead.

Also in our own time, Catholic hospitals and Catholic residential care organisations have shown great courage. They have united to find ways to model excellent care for their patients, and are committed to resisting calls to involve themselves in VAD. Please learn about their thoughtful and considered response to VAD, which is framed through their enduring commitment to excellence in end of life care, and show them your support.

All of us who hold a principled opposition to euthanasia are now, in effect, *conscientious objectors*.

- We object to the unnecessary taking of a human life;
- we object to the diminishment of the love that can be given and received in the last days of our loved ones;
- we object to the lack of adequate funding for excellent palliative care;
- we object to state-sponsored practices that facilitate suicide;
- and most of all we object to the lazy idea that the best response our community can offer a person in acute suffering is to end their life.


Christians in Victoria have asked their pastors and priests what they can do. In the information provided, we draw attention to our need to **pray**, to **be informed**, and to **act**.

We are called to engage with our Victorian communities with friendship and wisdom, not motivated by fear. We hold no animosity for those with whom we disagree – we simply wish to bear witness to what is good and true in those we love, and accompany them as Christ calls us. *We will not abandon those we love*, and we believe they have a right to be loved from the beginning to the end of their life.

As in all difficult moments of life and death, Christians look to the Good Shepherd who said:

“I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.” (John 10:10)

Working with Children Check Guidance – Resurrection Parish (Kings Park)

The Working with Children Check (WWCC) assists in protecting children and young people by ensuring that people who work with or care for them participate in a screening process based on an applicant's criminal record and any other professional conduct findings to determine whether the applicant poses a risk in relation to child-related work.

The WWCC excludes persons from working with children and young people on the basis of their involvement in:

- serious sexual offences
- serious violent offences
- serious drug offences.

A Working with Children Check (WWCC) is a legal requirement for people engaged in child-related work as defined by the *Working with Children Act 2005 (Vic)*.

Throughout the duration of the WWCC, a person's criminal record will be monitored in relation to these relevant offences and professional conduct findings in Victoria.

The onus for complying with the *Working with Children Act 2005 (Vic)* rests on both the individual and the organisation.

How does a Working with Children Check promote child safety?

In acknowledging that children and young people often hold those who work, volunteer or engage in ministry in Archdiocesan parishes, agencies and entities in high regard, we need to ensure that they have been appropriately screened through the WWCC process.

All persons working or in ministry in parishes, agencies and entities hold a position of trust within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne, irrespective of whether their role involves direct, indirect or no contact with children and young people.

The rigorous WWCC requirements of the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne exceed the requirements of the WWCC legislation. CAM's blanket approach to WWCCs ensures that we all stand united in creating safe environments for children and young people, and demonstrates our commitment to excluding persons who pose an obvious risk to children and young people from roles within our parishes, agencies and entities. WWCCs are an important component of the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne's comprehensive approach to promote the safety of children and young people.

WWCC requirement for clergy, employees and volunteers

All clergy, employees and volunteers over the age of 18 are required to maintain a current WWCC throughout their involvement in parishes, agencies and entities.

Employment in a paid or voluntary capacity and/or engagement in ministry is subject to and conditional upon a satisfactory WWCC.

Members of the clergy, employees and volunteers are responsible for maintaining a valid and current WWCC.

It is a requirement that clergy, employees and volunteers who do not have a current WWCC apply for a WWCC before commencement – and are able to provide an application receipt as evidence that they have applied for a WWCC.

The application process for a WWCC can be commenced online and finalised at participating Australia Post outlets.

A WWCC is valid for 5 years.

An employee check is valid for both paid and volunteer work and a fee applies.

A volunteer check is only valid for volunteer work and is free.

Requirement to register involvement with parishes, agencies and entities

Clergy, employees and volunteers are required to register their involvement with the parish, agency or entity within 21 days of their commencement.

This will enable the parish, agency or entity to be notified if there is a change in the status of the person's WWCC (e.g. suspension, withdrawal due to relevant charges or convictions).

The Check Status function on the Working with Children Check website enables organisations to check the status, type and expiry date of person's card or application:

Requirement to keep WWCC details up to date

Clergy, employees and volunteers are required to keep their WWCC details (e.g. name, address, telephone contact information, details of the organisation(s) they are engaged with) up to date, through the Working with Children Check website:

Parish, agency or entity obligations in relation to the WWCC

Archdiocesan parishes, agencies and entities must maintain a register of all WWCCs and ensure that WWCCs for clergy, employees and volunteers are appropriate to their situation (e.g. volunteer or employment), current and linked to the parish, agency or entity i.e. the person has registered their involvement with the parish, agency or entity.

Minimum requirements of the WWCC register:

- name of the member of the clergy, employee or volunteer
- role title(s)
- whether the role is a voluntary or employee role
- whether an exemption applies and an explanation of why an exemption applies e.g. person under the age of 18
- application receipt number (for those applying for a check)
- WWCC number
- card sighted column – for a signature of the person sighting the card
- expiry date
- currency/validity check through Working with Children Check website
- parish, agency or entity involvement has been registered

Parishes, agencies and entities are required to check the status of WWCCs through the Working with Children Check website upon commencement and ensure that each WWCC is linked with the parish, agency or entity.

Exemptions

There are limited circumstances where a WWCC is not required:

- Children under the age of 18 are exempt from the WWCC requirement unless they are supervising a person under the age of 15 in an employment situation.
- Interstate and overseas visitors are required to apply for a WWCC if they are in ministry, working or volunteering in Victoria for a period that exceeds 30 days per calendar year.
- People can engage in short-term or temporary volunteering or work within a parish for a period of up to 5 days in the same calendar year unless these activities are deemed to be high risk e.g. home

visiting, overnight stays, camps and overseas trips. Parish, agency or entity Safeguarding Committees are required to undertake a risk assessment to evaluate the possible risk associated with short-term or temporary roles to determine WWCC (and/or criminal history record check) requirements and strategies to reduce risk to children and young people. The Professional Standards Unit can assist you in determining your approach to short-term or temporary roles.

Parents working or volunteering in an activity in which their child usually participates

In our efforts to strengthen child safety, CAM has taken the decision to require parents who work or volunteer in an activity in which their child usually participates to undertake a WWCC. All employees and volunteers (irrespective of whether they are a parent of child or young person) interacting with children and young people within CAM are screened to ensure that they do not pose a risk to children and young people.

Victorian Institute of Teaching Registration and the WWCC

A teacher who holds a current registration with the Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) and is involved in child-related work in an educational setting is normally exempt from WWCC requirements.

However, for ministry or work (paid or voluntary) conducted in an Archdiocesan parish, agency or entity, CAM requires teachers to undertake a WWCC. This is because there is no direct mechanism for VIT to alert organisations if the teacher's registration has been suspended or cancelled. Therefore, it is a requirement that teachers undertake a WWCC and nominate the parish, agency or entity as the employment or volunteering organisation. This will ensure that the parish, agency or entity is notified if the WWCC card is suspended and/or withdrawn.

Police and the WWCC

Serving members of Victoria Police or the Australian Federal Police are exempt from the WWCC requirement under Victorian legislation. However, as there is no direct mechanism to alert organisations to the current status of the employment of the officer, within CAM police officers are required to undertake a WWCC and nominate the parish, agency or entity as the employment or volunteering organisation. This will ensure that CAM is notified if the WWCC card is suspended and/or withdrawn.

If a person declines to apply for or provide a WWCC

If a person declines to apply for or provide a WWCC, they are not permitted to engage in work or undertake a voluntary role within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne. The CAM Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy exceeds legal requirements in its expectations of clergy, staff and volunteers. The Professional Standards Unit of the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne should be contacted for further advice where a person has declined to meet the WWCC requirement.

With eyes bright and a huge smile, my friend told me about a project she was working on that would help spread the Gospel message to countless people. Her face beamed as she shared the different aspects of her project and how she had poured so much of her heart into it. I smiled and thought about today's First Reading, particularly the verse, "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

Seeing my friend's joy made me look at my own life and attitude. I wondered, What kind of giver am I? For the most part I try to be generous, but I'm not going to lie. There have definitely been times when I went down kicking and screaming, rather than with gracious generosity.

However, the closer I try to come to Our Lord, the more my heart is inspired to be a generous giver, whether physically or spiritually. There is still that fear that I won't have enough . . . Is there enough money to sponsor that child in need? Or how will I find the time to make a weekly Holy Hour? Or how can I accomplish this task when I feel so ill-qualified?

Yet, time and time again God has proven Saint Paul's words, "God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that in all things, always having all you need, you may have an abundance for every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8).

And you know what? He did.

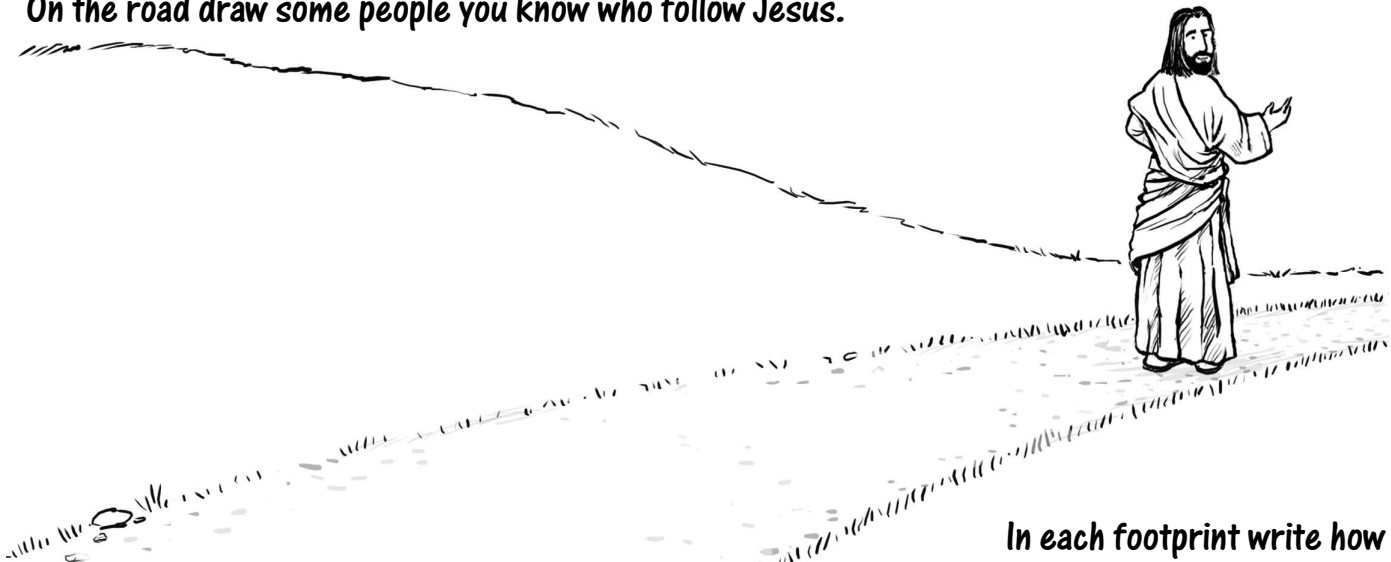

The closer I try to come to Our Lord, the more my heart is inspired to be a generous giver, whether physically or spiritually.

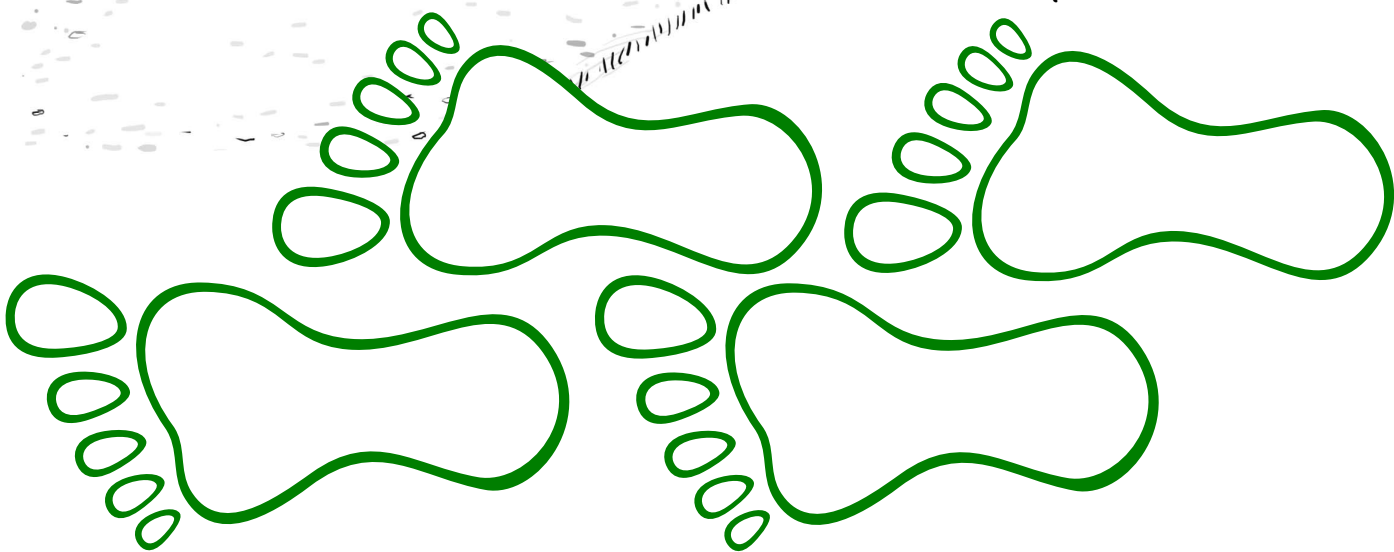

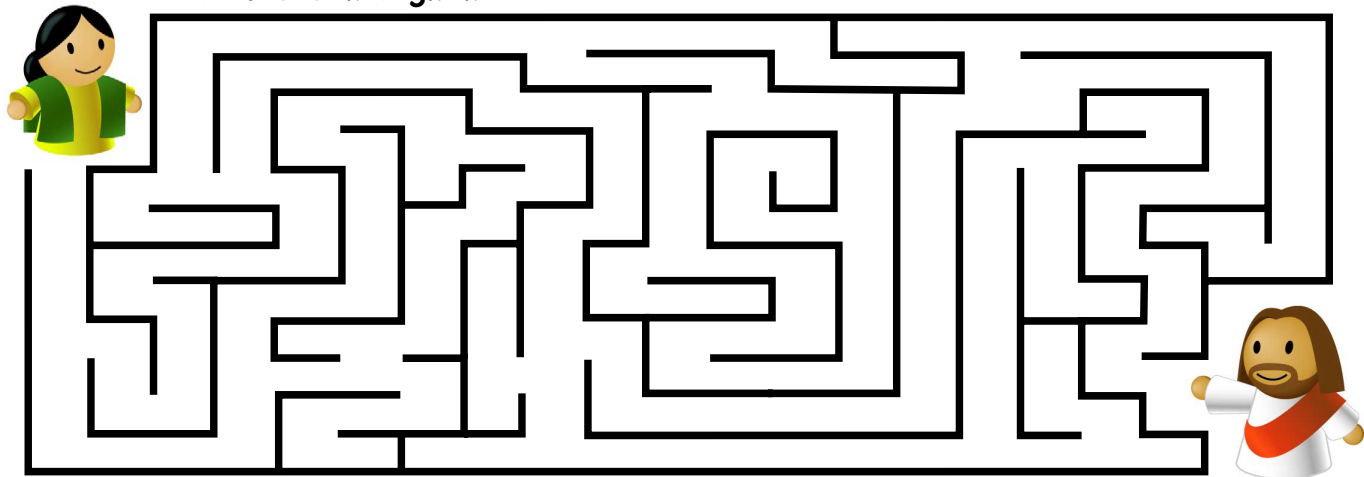
